a Full-time Textiles Conservator

in a permanent position at the earliest possible date.

The MARKK preserves a diverse and extensive textile collection from all regions of the world with a wide variety of materials and processing techniques. The care of these artefacts to support exhibitions and the collection management in the design of the textile storage will be core responsibilities of the position. The position reports to the Head of Conservation.

Requirements and Qualification

- Master's degree or Diploma in textile conservation from an internationallyrecognized graduate conservation program required.
- Knowledge of collection care and conservation of textiles and other organic, inorganic, and modern materials
- Knowledge in preventive conservation (IPM)
- Knowledge of making appropriate exhibition and long-term mounts for textile artefacts
- Relevant professional experience in a museum context; desirable also in the planning of museum storages with a specific focus on textiles
- Team and goal oriented working style, openness for interdisciplinary cooperation
- Initiative, independent and structured work style, very good organizational skills, flexibility and ability to work under pressure
- Good communication skills in German and English (spoken and written)
- Diversity competence and sensitivity for dealing with cultural artefacts from colonial contexts

Responsibilities and tasks include

- Planning and execution of preventive and inversive conservation measures for the care of the textile collection in preparation for exhibitions and loans
- Exhibition preparation, as well as support in exhibition installation and dismantling
- Continuous development and improvement of the packaging and storage of the textile collection
- Implementation of relevant measures for preventive conservation
- Supervision of interns
- Engaging the team and the public for conservation objectives and procedures
