The MARKK is looking for a Head of the Collection & Research Department in conjunction with the role of a Curator for Global Issues, Contemporary Art and Transcultural Collaboration. The contract is initially limited to 3.5 years (with possibility of permanent contract thereafter).

In this position, you will contribute curatorial global, overarching themes to the museum's work and exhibition programming, and oversee the curatorial department. You will liaise closely with the Director regarding the strategic direction of the museum's collection-related activities. In the leadership role, you will be responsible for the overall management of all departmental activities and its staff. The department includes the research and curatorial positions (regional collections, provenance research, projects), the collection documentation as well as the library, the photo archive and the documents archive. Important tasks over the next few years include the conceptualization and implementation of a new permanent display as part of the overall modernization of the MARKK. The position will play a central role in this process.

Your responsibilities:

- To contribute in shaping the positioning of the museum together with the Director and the curatorial team
- To further develop and implement the museum's research and exhibition strategy in together with the Director and in exchange particularly with the regional curators
- Member of the leadership team of the museum
- Budget and resource planning for the department as well as for research and for the exhibition programme of the museum together with the Director
- Supervising the team of the department in consultation with the Executive Directors
- Supporting the Director in the development and expansion of networks with universities, interest groups, associations and other stakeholders
- Supporting the Director in fundraising activities for research and exhibition projects

- Curation of global overarching themes with appropriate usage of the museum collections and contemporary global art
- Curation of exhibitions

Your qualifications:

- a PhD in cultural and social anthropology (ethnology), global art history or regional studies with a specific focus on material culture and contemporary art as well as knowledge of postcolonial theories and contemporary debates
- Several years of leadership experience or leadership of teams/ managing in a
 museum
- Outstanding scientific and curatorial expertise, proven by own exhibition projects on cross-regional topics, publications and participation in international research or cooperation projects
- Very good knowledge of current discourses in ethnological museums or in the museum sector in general and experience in dialogue projects with representatives of descendant societies and/or the diaspora
- International networking in the professional community
- Confident command of modern office communication (MS Office package)
- Experience in working with databases and collection documentation
- Very good communication skills as well as excellent leadership and social skills
- Very good understanding of operational structures and processes
- You should ha a strong ability to work in a team, be assertive, able to manage conflicts, resilient, reliable and structured way of working
- excellent written and spoken German and Englishrequired; if no German language skills are available, you must be committed to learn the language to at least C1 level within 3 years.
